This is a space for families to be fully engaged in worship, while providing quiet activities for young children to accommodate their natural need to move and be busy. ## THE WORD

### First Reading: Genesis 2:15-17; 3:1-7

*Human beings were formed with great care, to be in relationship with the creator, creation, and one another. The serpent's promise to the first couple that their eyes would be opened led, ironically, to the discovery only that they were naked.*

<sup>15</sup> The LORD God put the man in the Garden of Eden to take care of it and to look after it. <sup>16</sup> But the LORD told him, “You may eat fruit from any tree in the garden, <sup>17</sup> except the one that has the power to let you know the difference between right and wrong. If you eat any fruit from that tree, you will die before the day is over!”

<sup>1</sup>The snake was sneakier than any of the other wild animals that the Lord God had made. One day it came to the woman and asked, “Did God tell you not to eat fruit from any tree in the garden?” <sup>2</sup>The woman answered, “God said we could eat fruit from any tree in the garden, <sup>3</sup> except the one in the middle. He told us not to eat fruit from that tree or even to touch it. If we do, we will die.”

<sup>4</sup> “No, you won't!” the snake replied. <sup>5</sup> “God understands what will happen on the day you eat fruit from that tree. You will see what you have done, and you will know the difference between right and wrong, just as God does.”

<sup>6</sup> The woman stared at the fruit. It looked beautiful and tasty. She wanted the wisdom that it would give her, and she ate some of the fruit. Her husband was there with her, so she gave some to him, and he ate it too. <sup>7</sup> At once they saw what they had done,

and they realized they were naked. Then they sewed fig leaves together to cover themselves.

The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God!**

**Second Reading: Romans 5:12-19**

*Through Adam's disobedience, humanity came under bondage to sin and death, from which we cannot free ourselves. In Christ's obedient death, God graciously showers on us the free gift of liberation and life.*

<sup>12</sup> Adam sinned, and that sin brought death into the world. Now everyone has sinned, and so everyone must die. <sup>13</sup> Sin was in the world before the Law came. But no record of sin was kept, because there was no Law. <sup>14</sup> Yet death still had power over all who lived from the time of Adam to the time of Moses. This happened, though not everyone disobeyed a direct command from God, as Adam did.

In some ways Adam is like Christ who came later. <sup>15</sup> But the gift of God's undeserved grace was very different from Adam's sin. That one sin brought death to many others. Yet in an even greater way, Jesus Christ alone brought God's gift of undeserved grace to many people.

<sup>16</sup> There is a lot of difference between Adam's sin and God's gift. That one sin led to punishment. But God's gift made it possible for us to be acceptable to him, even though we have sinned many times. <sup>17</sup> Death ruled like a king because Adam had sinned. But that cannot compare with what Jesus Christ has done. God has treated us with undeserved grace, and he has accepted us because of Jesus. And so we will live and rule like kings.

<sup>18</sup> Everyone was going to be punished because Adam sinned. But because of the good thing that Christ has done, God accepts us and gives us the gift of life. <sup>19</sup> Adam disobeyed God and caused many others to be sinners. But Jesus obeyed him and will make many people acceptable to God.

**Gospel Reading: Matthew 4:1-11**

*Jesus experiences anew the temptations that Israel faced in the wilderness. As the Son of God, he endures the testing of the evil one.*

The holy gospel according to Matthew, chapter 4. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

<sup>1</sup> Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tested by the devil. <sup>2</sup> He fasted forty days and forty nights, and afterward he was famished. <sup>3</sup> The tempter came and said to him, “If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread.” <sup>4</sup> But he answered, “It is written, ‘One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.’ ”

<sup>5</sup> Then the devil took him to the holy city and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, <sup>6</sup> saying to him, “If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down, for it is written, ‘He will command his angels concerning you,’ and ‘On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone.’ ”

<sup>7</sup> Jesus said to him, “Again it is written, ‘Do not put the Lord your God to the test.’ ”

<sup>8</sup> Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory, <sup>9</sup> and he said to him, “All these I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me.” <sup>10</sup> Then Jesus said to him, “Away with you, Satan! for it is written, ‘Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him.’ ”

<sup>11</sup> Then the devil left him, and suddenly angels came and waited on him.

This is the gospel of our Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ!**

### **Church Rummage sale coming up!!!**

**Sale dates are March 11, 12, 13 with set up starting March 8.**

We will take any of your help you can offer starting after church on Sunday March 8. All day March 9 and 10 for set up. Then any time you can offer for sale dates. Each sale we get people who say they would love to help but are just unable. We all understand this - life happens. We want to help yet our job or family determine otherwise. I would like to offer some things you can do to help even if you think you can't help

First - bring donations. **But make sure they are clean and usable.**

Don't bring things that should just get thrown away. We always end up with bags of trash and have generous volunteers who take what they can to their own home trash can to ease the trash amount on the church.

Separate your items out. Kitchen from books from clothing.

If you are bringing clothing donations - simply make sure they are **clean** and right side out. If you are bringing small people clothes - separate them out into size bags. Even better band together sets so our volunteers know what goes together.

Label sheets and bedding with proper size.

Offer to bring others people's donations in for them if you can. We always have a handful of people who cannot bring in their own donations. Helping them out helps the greater cause.

And simply help spread the word.

This project is really a community service project. It is self-sufficient and does its best to not make anything a financial hardship on the church. A portion of the sales are taken off the top right away and sent to the general fund to offset the additional expenses of electricity.

Immanuel has three different scholarships you may apply for:

1. Immanuel Lutheran/Elmer & Doris Anderson Scholarship
2. Leland Schulze Scholarship
3. Thrivent Choice Dollars Scholarship

Each scholarship has a separate application, but are all similar in content. Confirmed members of Immanuel may apply for each scholarship up to two times. Applications have been mailed to all Immanuel seniors and all college students who have previously applied and are still eligible. Applications are also available in the church office and on the church website ([www.immanuelcaledonia.org](http://www.immanuelcaledonia.org)). Applications are due to the church office **no later than April 1, 2026.**

Applications will be reviewed by the Immanuel Scholarship Committee. After April 1, first time applicants will be invited to participate in a “meet and greet” session with the scholarship committee.

Presentation of scholarships will take place on Senior Recognition Sunday in April or May with the time still to be determined.
